Changes in Mandatory Reporting and Child Abuse:

Free Act 153 Information Session & Act 31 Certification Hosted by the Schuylkill United Way

The Schuylkill United Way (SUW) will host a free Act 153 information session and Act 31 certification on June 24th from 9-2pm at Penn State Schuylkill. The Pennsylvania General Assembly recently enacted comprehensive child protection reforms. These reforms are having a direct impact on adult volunteers in schools and community-based organizations. This free information session is being held in coordination with Senator Argall's office. Morning Session: Overview on PA's recent child protection reforms, particularly those impacting volunteers related to mandatory reporting of child abuse and complying with comprehensive background checks.

Afternoon "Break Out" Sessions: Participants must attend morning session to attend afternoon session, which includes State Approved Mandatory Reporting Training (Act 31) OR policy and implementation policies that agency leaders will have to tackle. This would be an option for individuals that already have their Act 31 training.

Registration is required. Priority given to Schuylkill County based individuals and organizations. Only two attendees per organization allowed, unless the organization is a Partner Agency of the Schuylkill United Way.
