We are grateful for the schools, libraries, and nursing homes that wrote over 900 letters for care packages for Operation Gratitude as part of Day of Caring!








17th SUW-HOMETOWN GOLF TOURNAMENTS

EMERGENCY FOOD & SHELTER PROGRAM (EFSP)

SUW is the administrator of the EFSP Federal Grant for Schuylkill County. These dollars are used for emergency food, rent, & utility assistance. There are six (6) local recipient organizations governed by a Board of Directors. SUW does not receive money from this grant.



ST. LUKE'S MINERS CAMPUS - COMMUNITY HEALTH PROGRAM

\$15,000 was awarded to St. Luke's Miners Campus Community Health Program to assist the Tamaqua area with food, clothing, community health initiatives, vision assistance, and more. Children and families are a primary focus of their work.



TAMAQUA AREA COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP

Living their vision, "to be a town where people care if you're happy," TACP focuses time and efforts on restoration and renovation projects, adding opportunities for civic engagement and development, and other initiatives to enhance the quality of life for all people in Tamaqua. \$5,000 was given for these efforts.
