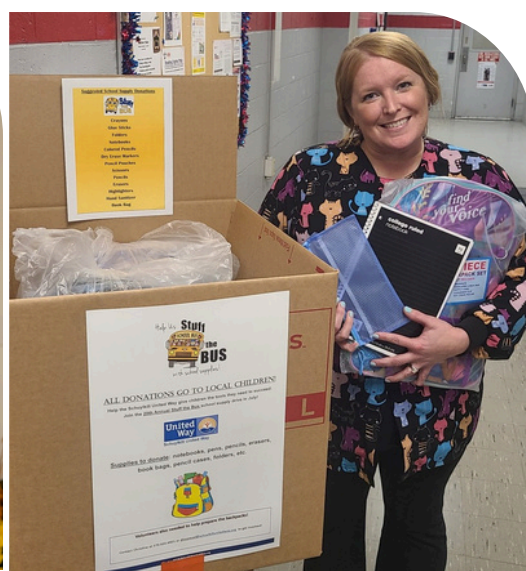

# New to SUW in 2023

## MEET A.L.I.C.E.

On September 21, 2023, Schuylkill United Way hosted United Way of Pennsylvania's Director of Public Policy, Mr. Philip Falvo to breakdown the newest ALICE data.

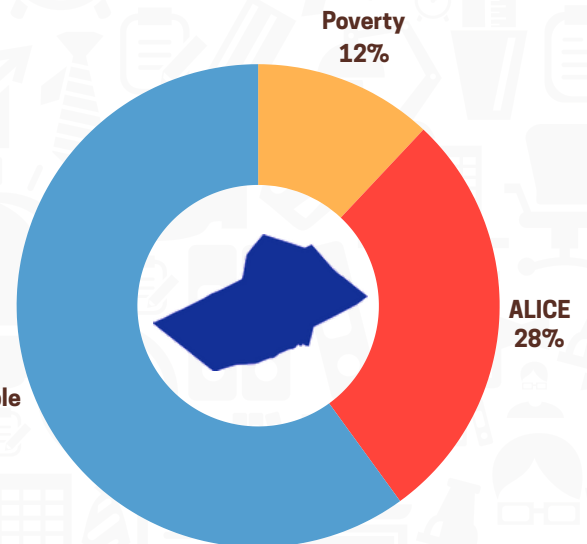
Mr. Falvo led an in-depth discussion on how ALICE data is obtained and what it reveals. The 35 attendees that included local, state, and federal leaders then worked to identify barriers for the individuals and families working 40 hours per week and still find themselves unable to make ends meet.

### Funding Child Care and Early Learning

Investments in child care and Pre-K are needed to stabilize the sector and ensure ALICE Households can continue to work.

- UWP supports investments to create a child care teacher wage scale that will compete in today's labor market and recognizes the qualifications of the professionals doing the work
- UWP supports increased funding for programs serving subsidized children that have reached a STAR 2, 3 or 4 rating

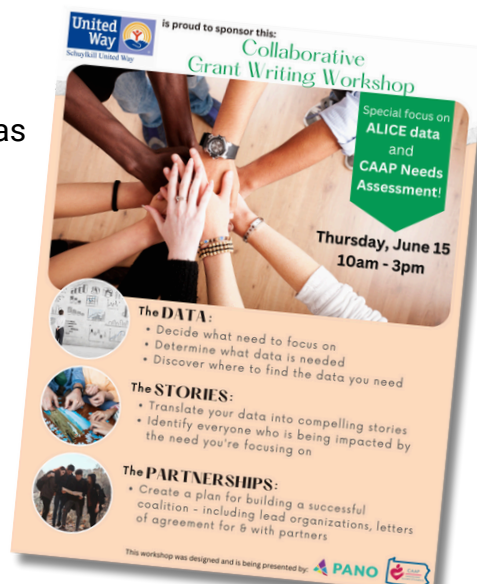

In 2020, SUW launched the Nurse's Pantry to provide school nurses essential items to help students stay healthy, stay focused, and stay in school.

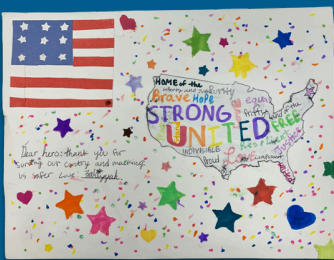


## SUW CAPT. JASON B. JONES MEMORIAL DAY OF CARING

### HELPING HARVEST

Schuylkill United Way was happy to award \$10,000 to Helping Harvest in support of their Senior Food Box Program, Mobile Markets, and Weekender Program that address food insecurity in our county.



### ST. LUKE'S MINERS CAMPUS - COMMUNITY HEALTH PROGRAM

\$10,000 was awarded to St. Luke's Miners Campus Community Health Program to assist the Tamaqua area with food, clothing, community health initiatives, vision assistance, and more. Children and families are a primary focus of their work.

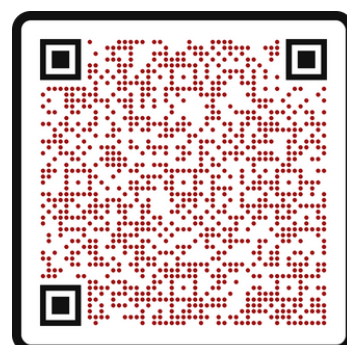
